Update from Project Manager, Nick Cleary



We have made good progress during the summer months and have been working everywhere along the bypass. We have moved a significant amount of the 2.5M tonnes of soil and rock to its final position and will continue with the earthworks until late Autumn as the weather allows. Drainage and other roadworks are progressing well at various locations and will continue over the Winter period.

We have completed Bridge 1 at Glandulas and 2 of the 4

underpasses and Bridge 6 on Upper Dolfor Road will soon be open to traffic also. Works are progressing well on all but one of the other structures and the photograph below shows the scale and complexity of the challenge in constructing Bridge 5 at Middle Dolfor Road. The structural steel beams are due to be erected

on Bridge 5 and Bridge 2 at Mochdre Lane before Christmas and this will require one of the largest cranes in the UK to lift them in to place.

Work will commence on the Pool Road bridge once the A483 has been diverted temporarily away from the bridge site. Works on the eastern tie in are currently being carried out to create the temporary diversion and this will mean that the roundabout on the Eastern tie - in will be the first part of the scheme open to traffic.

In general, we are happy with the progress to date and are on programme to meet our contract dates. We are still targeting a completion of late 2018 / early 2019 but there is still a lot of work to do before we can be more specific on a date. We have been considering what sort of event should be held to mark the opening of the bypass along the lines of a sponsored walk/ run/ cycle. We have already received some suggestions and several offers of support from local community groups which we are very grateful for. We will be giving this more consideration in early 2018 and will provide an update then.

Raising money for Cancer Research




